You may know already that Manchester City Council approached MSV Housing to work with them to bring new homes for local people across four sites in the Moss Side neighbourhood.

#### **Proposed sites:**

Site 1: The Reno

Site 2: Barnhill Street

Site 3: Land at the corner of

Westwood Street and Raby Street

Site 4: Greenhevs Adult Education Centre

## **West Indian Sports and Social Club**

Manchester City Council is also talking to representatives of the West Indian Sports and Social Club (WISSC) to ensure the club is preserved and their views are properly heard. They are working together to secure the future sustainability of the WISSC, developing proposals to refurbish the Club, and identifying potential grants and funding opportunities.

# What we've done so far

So that we could speak to as many people as possible and gather a wide range of views we:-



Established a steering group made up of local residents, community organisations and councillors who have met 7 times so far.



Established a new Moss Side newsletter for MSV residents.



Attended the Moss Side Residents Association monthly meetings to present our plans.



Met with key Stakeholders (KYSO Youth Group at the Powerhouse, students, and staff at MAES, WISSC, Windrush).



Launched a **survey** to gather views.



**Text** and **emailed** over **1,000** MSV customers in Moss Side to gather their views.



Delivered **4,000** leaflets in the area promoting the consultation and survey.



Advertised with **posters** in Local businesses



Ran a local **radio** campaign and displayed **posters** in local businesses advertising the event and survey.



Held a **community engagement event** on Saturday 22 July 2023 which was attended by over **70** members of the community.



Attended a local Primary School to engage with the **pupil ambassadors**.



Opened MSV's hub on Great Western Street for a weekly **drop in** so local people could talk to MSV's staff about the proposals.



Developed a new landing page on the MSV website specifically for the proposed Moss Side regeneration project.



Established a new 'Moss Side – We are listening' Facebook page.

# What you've said

During the consultation we received **268** completed surveys from members of the Moss Side community. The key points from the survey are:-



**50%** of respondents feel **housing options in Moss Side are poor.** 

**56%** of people responding said they are **satisfied with their** current housing, but 44% said they wanted to move to **another home** either in Moss Side or outside of the area.



**69%** of people said they know of someone in the area who has had **difficulty finding suitable housing** in Moss Side, with over **52%** of people saying there is a **lack of affordable homes** in the area.

56% told us they are aware of **overcrowding** or a lack of suitable housing in Moss Side.

59% of people feel there is a significant need for **more housing**.

We asked what improvements you would like to see in the area, and the Top 3 answers are:



- more Affordable Homes,
- Larger Homes, and,
- 3. more Green Spaces.

We also received feedback on the need to preserve the West Indian Sports and Social Club and to address issues such as anti-social behaviour and fly-tipping
